

Lecturer's Words of Wisdom



CHAPLAIN'S REFLECTION... Well, here we are at the end of our Lenten Journey. The season of Lent was our opportunity to travel inward, to search, to seek and to find. To search for all those things that over time has caused us to move away from Jesus...hurts, loss, confusion, anger, grudges, hatred, prejudice, judgement of others, and the list can go on and on. To seek out that what we have lost...faith, hope, love, joy, and peace. And to find it once again in a life that is shared with the Risen Christ. Everyday we are called to die in order that we may be able to rise to new life. We die to hate, that we may love. We die to doubt that we may have faith. We die to all that is within us that would separate us from a relationship with Christ, the lover of humanity. As Spring reveals to us every year, that which was dead or dormant comes alive once again, and that which looked hopeless is transformed to something that is beautiful and new. The freshness of the air, the greening of the grass, the budding of the trees...all a sign that something wonderful is about to happen. Holy Week fast approaches, and what an opportunity to witness to the power of love...God's love. With Palm Sunday welcoming Jesus into Jerusalem, we witness the joy of the people as they cry out "Blessed is He Who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the Highest!" The events of Holy Week indeed are sad, and we witness the heights of cruelty and hatred humanity is capable of, but it also reveals to us the love of a Father for His children. We also witness the humanity of our Saviour, who experienced the human experience fully and can understand our weakness and frailty. Jesus often was dismayed at the weak faith of his apostles, he expressed is frustration and anger freely. He experienced love and loss, doubt and fear, sadness and joy, despair, and hope. In Gethsemane he prayed "Father if you can take this cup from me, do so. Nonetheless, your will be done, not mine." He stood before Pilot defenseless, as God he chose silence. He was stripped in front of everyone, stripped of his dignity, mocked, and jeered by his own people. He was abandoned by those closest to him when he needed them most. On the cross he cried out in despair "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" and finally when his mortal body could take no more, he says "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit. Bowed his head and died." Good Friday is the revelation of a love story...it is not a day of despair but a day that witnesses to us the power of God's love. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only-begotten Son, that all who believe in Him will have eternal life.

Those who believe will never die but have life everlasting." The wounds of Christ have been opened and ravaged by hatred and war as seen in the suffering of our brothers and sisters in Ukraine who suffer daily under the violence and terrorism of Russia, and throughout the world million suffer countless sins against God's love. May we pray for them and for all of humanity that hearts of stone be turned once again to hearts of flesh. May we work in the communities in which live, reaching out to help with the hungry and homeless, touching hearts with love. Jesus did not bring people to him through coercion, but rather conversion. Through his words, his love, and his life. When anyone encountered him, they were transformed. Their lives were never the same. So, it is with you and I, Jesus comes by invitation, not by obligation. Invite him into your life today! It will never be the same. I wish and pray for all of you...An Easter filled with light and love, hope and faith, and peace of spirit. May you bask in the light of God's love, always, in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health, and when your time comes to be called home to the promise of this great Feast. God bless all of you!
