The oldest written account of the solemn celebration of the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord dates back to the fourth century and is the work of a Spanish Nun, Egeria, who kept a diary of her pilgrimage to the Holy Land toward the end of that century. In it she writes: "The fortieth day after Epiphany (read: Christmas) is indeed celebrated here (in Jerusalem) with the greatest solemnity. On that day there is a procession into the Anastasis (Basilica of the Resurrection), and all assemble there for the liturgy, and everything is performed in the prescribed manner with great solemnity." (Egeria, Diary of a Pilgrimage, ch. 26).

I have just been notified by MP Robert Bratina and the New Horizons for Seniors Grant Program that we have been successful in our grant application for years of 2019-2020, The amount we will receive is \$25,000.00 from the federal government. This money will go to replacing the carpet in the church which has become a serious hazard for our seniors. The total cost of the carpet replacement will be approximately \$32,000.00.

This is our 4th successful application for grant monies from the New Horizons for Seniors Program. Our total grant money is now \$100,000.

Our seniors club is growing and I applaud all the hard work that Sylvia and Oscar Horback put into making the club the success it is. The existence of the club lets us make these applications for grant money.

The seniors for a number of years have complained about the state of our chairs, namely the seat padding has deteriorated to the point of non existence. Unfortunately he church had other needs that needed our attention along with the money that went with it. I want to let them know that, this week we have put in our deposit to reupholster all the chairs in the hall and have upgraded the firm foam seat from 2" to 3". The project will start in a few weeks. The cost for the upgrade \$2 per chair. No expense is too great for seniors.

Also If anyone in the parish has an issue with the church property and its maintenance, please have them contact me.

The issues that are not of an emergent nature but fall under general maintenance should come to me so that I can address it with Jose and Zak. I maintain a file with these issues and can only do so if these issues go through me first. Often times, I have already discussed the issue with Zak and Jose or we have a plan that will deal with that issue along with others in financially prudent way. If it's an emergency such as a broken water pipe, furnace not working or some other major catastrophe by all means please contact any one of us on church council, which include Zak and Jose.

Property sale meeting

I met with the purchasing group on Wednesday, January 23, 2019. The buyer is meeting with the City of Hamilton on February 7, 2019 to obtain approval for an easement through their property behind the Church for access to sewer and drainage on Britannia Avenue. The buyer anticipates that this easement will be granted. The cost to join the sewer and drainage system to Melvin Avenue would be prohibitive and would make the severance and development of the property too expensive for the buyer to proceed. The buyer has purchased a property behind the Church in order to provide the easement to Britannia Avenue. In order to complete the severance and to proceed to closing an agreement needs to be in place between the seller and buyer for an easement through the back portion of the Church property where the new parking lot will need to be built. The drainage and sewer for the property being sold and for the remaining Church lands will need to go through the rear parking

lot area to attach to the easement being applied for on February 7. Costs for the drainage and sewer line will be borne by the buyer, but we will need to build the parking lot at the stage when the buyer starts his development. Estimates are now being determined for the cost of the parking lot. Father, Steve Hrab and myself will need to meet with the Eparchy for their approval of the agreement for the easement through the Church parking lot. With the agreed upon easements in place, severance should be granted, the buyer would wave their conditions before the end of February and closing should Jerry Pekaruk. occur before the end of March, 2019.
