

ROME (CNS) -- After special study, the German bishops' conference decided to stick with the traditional wording in the Lord's Prayer while the Italian bishops' conference has decided to change the words of the prayer in their translation of the Roman Missal.

The decisions come after the French bishops decided that beginning early December last year, French Catholics would change the line, "Lead us not into temptation," to the equivalent of "do not let us enter into temptation." French-speaking Catholics in Benin and Belgium began using the new translation at Pentecost last June. The common Spanish translation already is "no nos dejes caer en la tentacion" or "do not let us fall into temptation." Pope Francis said the Italian and English translations of the "Our Father" can give believers the wrong impression that God can and does lead people into temptation. He told "I'm the one who falls. But it's not (God) who pushes me into temptation to see how I fall. No, a father does not do this. A Father helps us up immediately."

Last Sunday January 28 at 5.00 p.m. Pope Francis visited the Ukrainian community in Rome and participated in the service in our St. Sofia church.

Today is the Presentation or Encounter of the Lord. This event is described in Luke 2:22-40. It is one of the significant 40-day periods we keep throughout the liturgical year - 40 days after the birth of Our Lord. Also, February 2 is winter's halfway mark. Candles are blessed today because Simeon called Jesus the light to the gentiles when Our Lord was presented in the temple. For centuries today's feast also officially concludes the 40-day Christmas season. At Baptism we received the light of Christ. We are to be the light of Christ wherever we go and whatever we do. How do we know that our baptismal light is aflame and burning brightly? We should ask ourselves:

- Are we patient with those who annoy us?
- Are we grateful? Do we accept that all is gift? All is grace?
- Do we assist the most vulnerable and needy people around us?
- Are we humble?
- Do we forgive as we wish to be forgiven?
- Do we accept others as daughters and sons of God and sisters and brothers to us?
- Are we kind? Are we mean-spirited?
- Are people in our family, parish, or at work better because we are a part of them?
- Do we lift people up?
