

The war rages on in Ukraine... why not have everyone in the parish write a short note in a Christmas Card (it doesn't need to be in Ukrainian) letting the brave men and women fighting for Ukraine that they are remembered and prayed for. Father Gerald Dunphy, St. Peter's, Nova Scotia, told a story: While walking through the parish not long ago, I met a father and his two uoung children walking their dog. I bent down to chat with the children and one of them immediately was fascinated with my Roman collar. "What is that?" she asked. When I replied it was my collar, she simplely said, "Does someone take you for a walk everyday?"

A Catholic priest was trying to explain to the congregation the difference between fact and faith. Among other things he said: "that you are sitting in front of me in church is a fact. That I am speaking to you is a fact. But it is faith alone that makes me believe any of you are listening."

The Lord spoke to Moses, saying: Command the Israelites, and say to them: When you enter the land of Canaan (this is the land that shall fall to you for an inheritance, the land of Canaan, defined by its boundries), your south sector shall extend from the wilderness of Zin alonf the side of Edom. Your southern boundry shall begin from the end of the Dead Sea on the east; your boundry shal turn south of the ascent of Akrabbim, and cross to Zin, and its outer limit shall be south of Kadesh-barne; then it shall go on to Hazar-addar, and cross to Azmon; the boundry shall turn from Azmon to Wadi of Egypt, and its termination she be at the Sea. For the Western boundryy, you shall have the Great Sea and its coast; this shall be your western boundry. This shall be your nothern boundry: from the Great Sea you shall mark out your line to Mount Hor; from Mount Hor you shall mark it out to Lebo-ha-math, and the outer limit of the boundary shall be Zedad; then the boundary shall extend to Ziphron, and its end shall be Hazar-enan; this shall be your nothern boundary. You shall mark out your eastern boundary from Hazar-enan to Shepham; and the boundary shall continue down from Shephan to Riblah on the east side of Ain; and the boundary shall go down and reach the eastern slope of the sea of Chinnereth; and the boundary shall go down to the Jordan, and its end shall be at the Dead Sea. This shall be your land with its boundaries all round.
